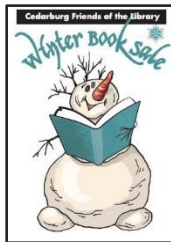

New program series: Bridge the Divide

Bridge The Divide (Cedarburg Conversations on Race) is a new series at CPL! This forum for discussion and action around racial reconciliation seeks to identify instances of inequality, foster empathy, and educate others to recognize their part in the problems and solutions in Ozaukee County. Erica Turner, Cedarburger and group facilitator, gained perspective regarding social justice growing up in poverty as a person of color, experiencing racial injustice in adulthood, and overcoming both to become a passionate advocate for treating all humanity with respect. The group will meet **the first Monday night of the month from 6-8 pm**, taking a break in summer and December. No registration required. The **Mon, Feb 5 meeting** will discuss what bias is and how to identify it within ourselves. Also, hosting guest speaker Dominic Inouye of ZIP MKE.
