The Bountiful Benefits of Owning a Library Card


It's kind of obvious, but a library card can provide access to many FREE resources, including:

- Books: including ebooks, audiobooks and large print. You can borrow works from digital collections in our Monarch2Go app or Libby app, or through partner services like Hoopla Digital and OverDrive.
- Movies and TV: you can stream movies and TV digitally through apps like Hoopla and Kanopy, or borrow hard copy DVDs.
- Museum passes: we offer free passes to some local museums and attractions.
- Classes: libraries offer free classes in hobbies, health, job search, employment skills, research, etc.
- **Online learning:** you can access resources like online test preparation and languages.
- Wi-Fi: we offer free Wi-Fi for studying or working.
- **Library of Things:** you can check out fun activities and equipment like backyard games, puzzles, boardgames, tech equipment, cookware, and so much more!
- Computer access: you can use the library's computers, printers and photocopiers.
- **Digital and technical equipment:** you can rent or use digital conversion equipment, large format printers and other technical equipment.

Hear about their unique way of life: courting, marriage, baptisms, weddings, funerals, schools, dress, German language, the Ordnung (set of rules for life), farm life, Amish manufacturing, auctions sales, horse and buggy transportation, community life, Church services, medical care, shunning, music, Amish newspapers, Rumspringa, and more.

Kevin Benson—director of plans for the United States Third Army, the ground forces command headquarters for GEN Franks' Central Command, at the start of the war—details the development of the invasion plan and its subsequent execution from D-Day in March 2003 until the change of command of operations in Iraq and the departure of Third Army in June 2003."
