Like many organizations across the country and world, Cedarburg Public Library and the City of Cedarburg are closely monitoring the developing COVID-19 situation.

What is Cedarburg Public Library doing?

Library Cleaning: We want you to feel confident visiting Cedarburg Public Library. We contract with an outside cleaning company that cleans and disinfects the building every evening. If you see an area in the building you think needs attention, please let us know.

Library Materials Cleaning: Some patrons have asked whether the library disinfects borrowed materials when they are checked in or as they are browsed or used in-house. We are not wiping down collection materials. Sanitizing supplies are in short supply and we cannot obtain enough to clean the volume of materials we handle each day. You may wipe down library materials when you borrow or return them. We provide sanitizing wipes, while supplies last, and staff can assist you with this if asked.

Please keep in mind that as a public space, the library cannot guarantee a germ-free environment or germ-free physical materials. You need to consider if using library materials or visiting the library or other public spaces is best for you and your family.

Staff and Patron Hygiene: While supplies last, we have hand sanitizer and wipes available to staff and patrons. We encourage frequent hand-washing, per CDC guidelines.

Library Services: We are developing staffing and service models should we need to alter library services.
